2	To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2363(15), relative to environmental quality; to provide
3	definitions of a reportable release; to provide for the reportable quantity of a release
4	from natural gas pipelines; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 30:2363(15) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§2363. Definitions
8	The following terms as used in this Chapter shall have the following

11	(15) "Reportable release" means a release of a regulated hazardous material
12	or substance which causes any injury requiring hospitalization or any fatality, results
13	in a fire or explosion which could reasonably be expected to affect the public safety
14	beyond the boundaries of the facility, or exceeds the reportable quantity when that
15	reportable quantity, as defined pursuant to rules promulgated by the deputy secretary,
16	could be reasonably expected to escape beyond the site of the facility. A reportable
17	release as defined herein shall be based upon the quantity of hazardous material or

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> defines "reportable release" as a release of regulated hazardous material or substance which causes any injury requiring hospitalization or any fatality during a one-time discharge, whether continuously or intermittently during a 24 hour period.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that a "reportable release" will only apply to natural gas from a pipeline with a reportable quantity of one thousand pounds or more.

Effective August 1, 2012.
