Those persons required to register pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall appear in person at the sheriff's office in the parish of residence, or the 12 13 police department in the case of a municipality with a population in excess of three hundred thousand, where the offender is currently registered to update information 14 within three business days of establishing a new or additional physical residential 15 address or of changes in information previously provided when any of the following 16 17 occur:

## **DIGEST**

<u>Present law</u>, relative to sex offenders, provides that those persons required to register pursuant to <u>present law</u> shall appear in person at the sheriff's office in the parish of residence, or the police department in the case of a municipality with a population in excess of 300,000, where the offender is currently registered to update information within three business days of establishing a new or additional physical residential address or of changes in information previously provided when any of the following occur:

- (1) The offender changes his place of residence or establishes a new or additional residence; or
- (2) When the offender has vacated his current address of registration with the intent not to return; or
- (3) When the offender has been absent from his current address of registration for more than 30 consecutive days or an aggregate of 30 days or more per calendar year and is physically present at another address during that same time period; or
- (4) The offender has a change in name, place of employment, or enrollment.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but expands to include any change in any information previously provided pursuant to <u>present law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2012.
