DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> provides that the immunity from civil liability which is provided under the workers' compensation provisions is not extended to certain persons.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that immunity from civil liability does not extend to an employer who intentionally removes or fails to provide adequate safeguards and security measures, thereby failing to provide a workplace free from serious recognized hazards.
