SCHOOLS. Provides relative to policies prohibiting harassment, intimidation, and bullying in public schools. (8/1/12)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:416.13(A), (B)(1) and (2), (C), and (D)(1) and (2), to enact
3	R.S. 17:81(W) and 3996(B)(30), and to repeal R.S. 17:416.13(B)(4), relative to
4	harassment, intimidation, and bullying in public schools; to provide relative to codes
5	of conduct for school employees and for students; to require such codes of conduct
6	to have policies which prohibit the harassment, intimidation, and bullying of students
7	and of school employees; to provide relative to definitions; to remove provisions
8	excepting certain parishes from certain requirements relative to student codes of
9	conduct; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 17:416.13(A), (B)(1) and (2), (C), and (D)(1) and (2) are hereby
12	amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:81(W) and 3996(B)(30) are hereby enacted to read as
13	follows:
14	§81. General powers of city, parish, and other local public school boards
15	* * *
16	W.(1) Each city, parish, and other local public school board shall adopt
17	<u>a code of conduct for its school employees that is in compliance with all existing</u>

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1	rules, regulations, and policies of the board and of the State Board of
2	Elementary and Secondary Education and that includes any necessary
3	disciplinary action to be taken against any employee who violates the code of
4	<u>conduct.</u>
5	(2) Each board shall adopt and incorporate into its code of conduct a
6	policy prohibiting the harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including
7	cyberbullying, of a student or a school employee by a school employee. For the
8	purposes of this Subsection, the terms "harassment", "intimidation",
9	"bullying", and "cyberbullying" shall be defined as in R.S. 17:416.13.
10	(3) Each board shall provide training for school employees with respect
11	to harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including cyberbullying.

14	bullying; prohibition; exemptions
15	A. By not later than August 1, 1999, each Each city, parish, and other local
16	public school board shall adopt a student code of conduct for the students in its
17	school system. Such code of conduct shall be in compliance with all existing rules,
18	regulations, and policies of the board and of the State Board of Elementary and
19	Secondary Education and all state laws relative to student discipline and shall include
20	any necessary disciplinary action to be taken against any student who violates the
21	code of conduct.
22	B.(1) By not later than August 1, 2001, each Each city, parish, and other
23	local public school board shall adopt and incorporate into the student code of
24	conduct, as provided in this Section, a policy prohibiting the harassment,
25	intimidation, and bullying of a student or school employee by another a student.
26	(2) For purposes of this Subsection, the terms "harassment", "intimidation",
27	and "bullying" shall mean any intentional fear-inducing, threatening, or abusive
28	gesture or written, verbal, or physical act, including audio-visual forms of
29	expression, that:

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1	(a) A reasonable person under the circumstances <b>knows or</b> should know will
2	have the effect of harming a student or school employee or damaging his personal
3	or intellectual property or placing a student or school employee in reasonable fear
4	of harm to his life or person or damage to his <b>personal or intellectual</b> property; and
5	(b) Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating,
6	threatening, or abusive educational or work environment for a student or school
7	<u>employee</u> .

10	limited to race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, exceptionality, physical

13	characteristic, gender identity, gender expression, political ideas or affiliations,

21	of a student or school employee by another a student specifically addresses the
22	nature, extent, causes, and consequences of cyberbullying.
23	(2) For the purposes of this Subsection, the term "cyberbullying" shall mean
24	harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student or school employee on school
25	property by another $\underline{a}$ student using a computer, mobile phone, or other interactive
26	or digital technology or harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student or school
27	employee while off school property by another a student using any such means when
28	the action or actions are intended to have an effect on the student or school
29	employee when the student is on school property.

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1	D.(1) Beginning on January 1, 2011, and continuing thereafter, the The
2	governing authority of each public elementary and secondary school shall inform
3	each student, in writing within ten days after enrolling in school of the prohibition
4	against harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including cyberbullying, of a student
5	or school employee by another $\underline{a}$ student; the nature and consequences of such
6	actions; and the proper process and procedure for reporting any incidents involving
7	such prohibited actions.
8	(2) By not later than January 1, 2011, the <u>The</u> governing authority of each
9	public elementary and secondary school shall develop and adopt a policy
10	establishing procedures for the investigation of reports of harassment, intimidation,
11	and bullying, including cyberbullying, of a student or school employee by another
12	<u>a</u> student.

14	§3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements

16	B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and
17	except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a
18	charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
19	Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be
20	exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are
21	applicable to public schools and to public school officers and employees except for
22	the following laws otherwise applicable to public schools with the same grades:

## DIGEST

Code of conduct for students:

<u>Present law</u> requires each public school board to adopt and incorporate into its student code of conduct a policy prohibiting the harassment, intimidation, and bullying of a student by another student.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires such policy to also prohibit student harassment, intimidation, and bullying of school employees.

<u>Present law</u> defines the terms "harassment", "intimidation", and "bullying" as any intentional gesture or written, verbal, or physical act that:

- (1) A reasonable person under the circumstances should know will have the effect of harming a student or damaging his property or placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to his life or person or damage to his property; and
- (2) Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student.

<u>Proposed law</u> redefines harassment, intimidation, and bullying to mean any fear-inducing, threatening, or abusive gesture or written, verbal, or physical act, including audio-visual forms of expression, that:

- (1) A reasonable person under the circumstances knows or should know will have the effect of harming a student or school employee or damaging his personal or intellectual property or placing a student or school employee in reasonable fear of harm to his life or person or damage to his personal or intellectual property and that creates a fear-inducing, threatening, or abusive education or work environment for a student or school employee.
- (2) A reasonable person under the circumstances would perceive as being motivated by any actual or perceived characteristic, including but not limited to race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, exceptionality, physical disability, intellectual disability, developmental disability, mental illness or emotional health disorder, language ability, sexual orientation, physical characteristic, gender identity, gender expression, political ideas or affiliations, socioeconomic status, or association with others identified by such characteristics.

<u>Present law</u> requires student codes of conduct to prohibit cyberbullying, which is defined as the harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student on school property using a computer, mobile phone, or other interactive or digital technology or harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student while off school property using any such means when the action or actions are intended to have an effect on the student when on school property.

<u>Proposed law</u> broadens the definition of cyberbullying to prohibit the cyberbullying not only of students but of school employees.

<u>Present law</u> exempts the parishes of Livingston, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, West Feliciana, St. Helena, and Tangipahoa from the <u>present law</u> requirement that each school board adopt and incorporate into its student code of conduct a policy prohibiting harassment, intimidation, and bullying.

Page 5 of 6 Coding: Words which are struck through are deletions from existing law; words in **boldface type and underscored** are additions. Proposed law deletes this exemption.

Code of conduct for school employees:

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each public school board to adopt a code of conduct for school employees which shall include a policy prohibiting the harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including cyberbullying, of a student or a school employee by a school employee. Also requires school boards to provide training for school employees regarding harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including cyberbullying. Defines these terms as provided in proposed law relative to student codes of conduct (see above).
