AN ACT

2	To enact Part II-C of Chapter 8 of Title 17 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be
3	comprised of R.S. 17:1970.31 through 1970.33, relative to establishment of an
4	international language immersion school exploratory committee; to provide relative
5	to the development of an implementation plan for an international school; to provide
6	for membership, duties and functions of such committee; to provide for a report; and
7	to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. Part II-C of Chapter 8 of Title 17 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes o
10	1950, to be comprised of R.S. 17:1970.31 through 1970.33, is hereby enacted to read as
11	follows:
12	PART II-C. INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL IN LAFAYETTE
13	§1970.31. Legislative intent
14	A. It is the intent of the legislature to establish a world language
15	immersion school for the express purpose of providing an expansive and
16	challenging educational experience for the students of this state, thereby
17	enabling such students to reach their full potential and be productive citizens
18	B. The legislature finds that the development of a world language skills
19	program and cultural expertise are crucial in addressing the economic

challenges facing the state and nation in the global marketplace. Professions

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1	including but not limited to law, health care, education, tourism, hospitality,
2	agriculture, and oil and gas all require an international dimension that reflects
3	the ever-changing world environment and Louisiana's increasingly diverse
4	population.
5	C. The legislature recognizes that sustained, intensive, continuous
6	sequences of second language study results in the following benefits:
7	(1) Increases awareness of and appreciation for other cultures and
8	people.
9	(2) Develops a high proficiency in a second or third target language other
10	than English.
11	(3) Enhances problem-solving capabilities.
12	(4) Improves memory and listening skills, and has a positive effect on
13	intellectual growth.
14	(5) Enhances understanding of an individual's primary language.
15	(6) Better prepares students for the twenty-first century job market.
16	(7) Preserves the heritage language of Acadians and the related economic
17	value of the Cajun Creole culture in Louisiana.
18	§1970.32. International school in Lafayette; exploratory committee; creation;
19	membership; terms; duties and functions; voting; compensation
20	A. There is hereby created an exploratory committee, hereinafter
21	referred to as "committee", to develop a plan regarding the creation and
22	establishment of an international language immersion school at the University
23	of Louisiana at Lafayette. The membership of the committee shall be as follows:
24	(1) The executive director of the Cecil J. Picard Center for Child
25	Development and Lifelong Learning, or his designee.
26	(2) The executive director of Le Centre International De Lafayette, or his
27	designee.
28	(3) One member to represent the French Consulate, appointed by the
29	Consulate General of France in New Orleans, who shall serve as an ex officio
30	member.

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1	(4) Two members of the Council for the Development of French in
2	Louisiana, appointed by the chairman thereof.
3	(5) The city-parish president of Lafayette Parish, or his designee.
4	(6) The superintendent of schools for the Lafayette Parish School System,
5	or his designee.
6	(7) One member to represent the Greater Lafayette Chamber of
7	Commerce, appointed by the president of the chamber.
8	(8) One member of the Senate whose district is located in Lafayette
9	Parish.
10	(9) Two members of the House of Representatives whose districts are
11	located in Lafayette Parish.
12	(10) A member of the Senate who is a member of the Acadiana
13	delegation and whose district does not include Lafayette Parish, appointed by
14	the president of the Senate.
15	(11) A member of the House of Representatives who is a member of the
16	Acadiana delegation and whose district does not include Lafayette Parish,
17	appointed by the speaker of the House.
18	(12) The state superintendent of education, or his designee.
19	(13) The president of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, or his
20	designee.
21	(14) The president of the Lafayette Economic Development Authority,
22	or his designee.
23	B. The committee shall:
24	(1) Consider the location, structure, management, and operation of an
25	international language immersion school.
26	(2) Research potential agreements, in accordance with applicable law,
27	with other public agencies with respect to developing partnerships and
28	cooperative enterprises and undertakings related to or associated with an
29	educational purpose or educational program affecting education at the school.
30	$\underline{(3) Provide for the collaboration and partnership with similarly designed}$

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1	schools.
2	(4) Determine the curriculum to be offered at the school, including
3	French as the primary immersion language and consider the addition of other
4	languages to the curriculum, including but not limited to Spanish and Mandarin
5	Chinese.
6	(5) Establish criteria to be used in determining eligibility of students for
7	enrollment.
8	(6) Determine the number of students to be served by the school.
9	(7) Determine the number and type of faculty and staff positions
10	necessary for the efficient operation of the school.
11	(8) Determine the budget necessary for the operation of the school.
12	(9) Determine the feasibility of opening the school by the beginning of the
13	<u>2014-2015 school year.</u>
14	(10) Provide for the consideration of any other item or requirement that
15	may be necessary to establish an international language immersion school.
16	C. Nine members of the committee shall constitute a quorum and all
17	official action of the committee shall require the favorable vote of a majority of
18	those members present and voting. All members of the committee, including ex
19	officio members, shall be voting members.
20	D. Members of the committee shall serve until such time as the school is
21	established and begins operation.
22	E. Members of the committee shall serve without compensation.
23	<u>§1970.33. Report</u>
24	The committee shall submit a written report and implementation plan
25	for the establishment of an international language immersion school to the
26	Senate Committee on Education and House Committee on Education not later
27	than March 31, 2013.
28	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
29	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
30	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.
