CENSUS. Provides relative to provisions in the Code of Civil Procedure which are limited in applicability to political subdivisions or local areas meeting specified population characteristics.

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact Code of Civil Procedure Article 2294.1(A), relative to provisions of  
3 the Code of Civil Procedure which are limited in applicability to certain political  
4 subdivisions or local areas based upon population classifications; to specify  
5 applicability to one or more political subdivisions or local areas; and to provide for  
6 related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 2294.1(A) is hereby amended and  
9 reenacted to read as follows:

10 Art. 2294.1. Time for seizure; return; ~~certain~~ city courts **in Orleans Parish**

11 A. A seizure may be made under a writ of fieri facias issued by a city court  
12 ~~of any city having a population in excess of four hundred seventy-five thousand~~ **in**  
13 **Orleans Parish**, only within six months from the date of its issuance.

DIGEST

Proposed law, contained in the Code of Civil Procedure, legislates with regard to classifications of parishes, municipalities, or other political subdivisions or local areas according to population by enacting local bills to limit the application of laws based upon specific classifications to one or more parishes, municipalities, or other political subdivisions or local areas, by adjusting the population ranges affected by the 2010 census, and by repealing certain provisions based upon certain population classification ranges, as follows:
