CONDOLENCES. Expresses condolences upon the death of Clarence Eugene Faulk, Jr.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the death of
3	Clarence Eugene Faulk, Jr.
4	WHEREAS, it was with deep regret and profound sorrow that the members of the
5	Legislature of Louisiana learned of the death of Clarence Eugene Faulk, Jr., on Friday,
6	March 5, 2010; and
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Faulk was born January 9, 1909 in West Monroe and lived to see
8	a century of life in his beloved state of Louisiana; and
9	WHEREAS, after two years at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee,
10	he transferred to the School of Journalism at the University of Missouri where he met his
11	loving wife, Louise; and
12	WHEREAS, upon returning to Louisiana, Mr. Faulk became publisher of the Ruston
13	Daily Leader, a position he maintained for thirty-two years; and
14	WHEREAS, although he was not drafted into World War II because of a serious eye
15	condition, he served as a first lieutenant in the Home Guard, and was a member of the War
16	Price and Rationing Board, and was chairman of the Lincoln Parish effort for the United
17	States Savings Bond Program, and later became an unofficial historian on Camp Ruston, a
18	prisoner of war camp that held thousands of German and Italian prisoners during the war;

2 WHEREAS, he brought the city of Ruston its first radio station in 1947 and managed 3 it for twenty-one years; and 4 WHEREAS, he served for many years as the president of the Louisiana Press Association and the Louisiana Association of Broadcasters; and 5 WHEREAS, of great importance to him were his memberships in Trinity Methodist 6 7 Church, where he served many functions, including teaching Sunday school for twelve years, 8 and the Ruston Kiwanis Club, where he was a member for seventy years and served as a 9 president; and 10 WHEREAS, his devotion to the community of Ruston was wide and varied and he 11 was actively involved in the Ruston-Lincoln Parish Centennial, the Peach Festival, the 12 Lincoln Parish Housing Authority which he chaired for twenty-nine years, and the Lincoln 13 Parish Library; and 14 WHEREAS, in good times and in bad he was a faithful supporter and contributor to 15 the Department of Journalism at Louisiana Tech University, where he founded the Clarence 16 and Louise Faulk Chair of Journalism; and WHEREAS, Mr. Faulk's one hundredth birthday in January 2009 was the occasion 17 18 of a festive party in which he received a Certificate of Honor from Louisiana Tech 19 University, an Expression of Commendation along with a Letter of Special Recognition from Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal, and a proclamation from the mayor of Ruston designating 20 January 9th "Clarence Faulk Day"; and 21 WHEREAS, as he was a well recognized source of oral history about Ruston and 22 23 North Louisiana, he greatly enjoyed telling stories that were filled with historical gems, and 24 he became known as an expert on the 1934 ambush of Bonnie and Clyde, since as a young newspaper reporter he covered the story on the scene; and 25 WHEREAS, those who knew him best in business and in his personal life recognize 26 27 that his love for Ruston and his place in the community were major driving forces in his life; and 28 WHEREAS, the memory of Mr. Clarence Faulk will remain eternal in the hearts and 29 30 minds of his family, friends, and all of those who loved him.
