SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5

BY SENATOR AMEDEE

CONGRESS. Memorializes Congress to adopt legislation postponing EPA's effort to regulate greenhouse gas emissions.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 To memorialize the Congress of the United States to adopt legislation which would postpone the Environmental Protection Agency's effort to regulate greenhouse gas 3 4 emissions. WHEREAS, on December 7, 2009, the administrator of the United States 5 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) signed two distinct findings regarding greenhouse 6 7 gases under the federal Clean Air Act: (1) Endangerment finding - the current and projected 8 concentrations of six key well-mixed greenhouse gases (carbon dioxide, methane, nitrous 9 oxide, hydrofluorocarbons, perfluorocarbons, and sulfur hexafluoride) in the atmosphere 10 threaten the public health and welfare of current and future generations; and (2) Cause or 11 contribute finding - the combined emissions of these well-mixed greenhouse gases from new motor vehicles and new motor vehicle engines contribute to the greenhouse gas 12 13 pollution which threatens public health and welfare; and WHEREAS, these findings are a prerequisite to finalizing the EPA's proposed 14 greenhouse gas (GHG) emission standards for light-duty vehicles; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in addition to emission standards for light-duty vehicles, these findings also trigger the regulation of GHG emissions from stationary sources, like manufacturing 17 facilities, power plants, hospitals, and commercial establishments; and 18

1 WHEREAS, regulating GHG emissions from stationary sources under the Clean Air 2 Act would be a great anchor on manufacturing and the economy in general; and 3 WHEREAS, the pending EPA effort would burden progress on two of the nation's 4 top priorities: environmental improvement and economic recovery by imposing onerous permitting requirements that will significantly delay or even eliminate investments in new 5 6 energy efficient technologies; and 7 WHEREAS, in 2009, over four million jobs were lost and regulations on GHG emissions from stationary sources have the potential to cause even more job losses; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the regulatory requirements of the Clean Air Act will overwhelm state 10 agencies, which are not equipped to handle the estimated six million permitting requests; and 11 WHEREAS, only Congress can act to avoid the significant costs and burdens 12 imposed by the regulations on stationary sources; and 13 WHEREAS, in order to safeguard American jobs, ensure affordable energy for America, and maintain America's global competitiveness, the Congress of the United States 14 should adopt legislation postponing the EPA's efforts to regulate greenhouse gas emissions. 15 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana memorializes 16 17 the Congress of the United States to adopt legislation that would postpone EPA's effort to 18 regulate greenhouse gas emissions from stationary sources using existing Clean Air Act 19 authority until Congress adopts a balanced approach to address climate change and energy 20 supply issues without crippling the economy. 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the secretary of the United States Senate and the clerk of the United States House of 22 23 Representatives and to each member of the Louisiana delegation to the United States 24 Congress.
