SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 89

SENATE. Designates May 5, 2014, as Vietnam Veterans Day.

1 A RESOLUTION

2 To designate May 5, 2014, as Vietnam Veterans Day and to commemorate the brave and
3 steadfast service by America's Armed Forces during a time of upheaval on the home
4 front and change on all sides.

5 WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was fought in the Republic of Vietnam from 1961 to
6 1975, and involved North Vietnamese regular forces and Viet Cong guerrilla forces in armed
7 conflict with United States Armed Forces and the Army of the Republic of Vietnam; and

8 WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces became involved in Vietnam because
9 the United States Government wanted to provide direct military support to the government
10 of South Vietnam to defend itself against the growing Communist threat from North
11 Vietnam; and

12 WHEREAS, members of the United States Armed Forces began serving in an
13 advisory role to the government of the Republic of Vietnam in 1961; and

14 WHEREAS, as a result of the Gulf of Tonkin incidents on August 2 and 4, 1964,
15 Congress overwhelmingly passed the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution (Public Law 88-408), on
16 August 7, 1964, which provided the authority to the President of the United States to
17 prosecute the war against North Vietnam; and

18 WHEREAS, in 1965, United States Armed Forces ground combat units arrived in

1 Vietnam; and

2 WHEREAS, by the end of 1965, there were 80,000 United States troops in Vietnam,
3 and by 1969, a peak of approximately 543,000 troops was reached; and

4 WHEREAS, on January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed, which required the
5 release of all United States prisoners-of-war held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of
6 all United States Armed Forces from South Vietnam; and

7 WHEREAS, on March 30, 1973, the United States Armed Forces completed the
8 withdrawal of combat units and combat support units from South Vietnam; and

9 WHEREAS, on April 30, 1975, North Vietnamese regular forces captured Saigon,
10 the capitol of South Vietnam, effectively placing South Vietnam under Communist control;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, more than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their
13 lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members of the Armed Forces were wounded,
14 including many of Louisiana's finest; and

15 WHEREAS, in 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated in the District
16 of Columbia to commemorate those members of the United States Armed Forces who died
17 or were declared missing-in-action in Vietnam; and

18 WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was an extremely divisive issue among the people of
19 the United States and a conflict that caused a generation of veterans to wait too long for the
20 United States public to acknowledge and honor the efforts and services of such veterans; and

21 WHEREAS, members of the United States Armed Forces who served bravely and
22 faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War were often wrongly criticized for
23 the policy decisions made by four presidential administrations in the United States; and

24 WHEREAS, the establishment of a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" would
25 be an appropriate way to honor those members of the United States Armed Forces who
26 served in South Vietnam and throughout Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

27 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana:

28 A. Honors and recognizes the contributions of veterans, particularly Louisiana
29 veterans, who served in the United States Armed Forces in Vietnam during war and during
30 peace.

1 B. Encourages the state and its local governments to establish "Welcome Home
2 Vietnam Veterans Day".

3 C. Encourages the people of Louisiana to observe "Welcome Home Vietnam
4 Veterans Day" with appropriate ceremonies and activities that:

5 (1) Provide the appreciation Vietnam War veterans deserve, but did not receive upon
6 returning home from the war.

7 (2) Demonstrate the resolve that never again shall the nation and this state disregard
8 and denigrate a generation of veterans.

9 (3) Promote awareness of the faithful service and contributions of such veterans
10 during their military service as well as to their communities since returning home.

11 (4) Promote awareness of the importance of entire communities empowering
12 veterans and the families of veterans to readjust to civilian life after military service.

13 (5) Promote opportunities for such veterans to assist younger veterans returning from
14 the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan in rehabilitation from wounds, both seen and unseen, and
15 to support the reintegration of younger veterans into civilian life.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
17 Governor Bobby Jindal, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, the Louisiana
18 Municipal Association, the Police Jury Association of Louisiana, the Louisiana School
19 Boards Association, and Alfred Cochran.
