Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Paragraph (b) of section 9 of chapter 224 of the acts of 2012 is hereby
- 2 amended by striking out sections (1) and (2) and inserting in place thereof the following two new
- 3 sections:
- 4 (1) For calendar years 2013 through 2015, the health care cost growth benchmark shall be
- 5 equal to the growth rate of potential gross state product established under section 7H½ of chapter
- 6 29; provided, however, that the growth rate of potential gross state product for calendar year
- 7 2013 shall be 3.6 per cent.
- 8 (2) For calendar years 2016 through 2022, the health care cost growth benchmark shall be
- 9 equal to the growth rate of potential gross state product established under said section 7H½ of
- 10 said chapter 29, minus 2 per cent.
