By Mr. Rushing of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1063) of Byron Rushing and others for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) to study the feasibility of creating and funding a universal children’s college savings account. Higher Education.

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act to establish a commission to study the feasibility of creating and funding a universal children’s savings account.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. A special commission after this referred to as the Children’s Savings  
2 Account Study Commission, is hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation  
3 and study relative to the feasibility of creating, structuring, managing, marketing, and funding a  
4 universal children’s savings account program, the purpose of which shall be to promote financial  
5 literacy and higher education access among low and moderate income families.

6 SECTION 2. The commission shall include the house and senate chairs of the joint  
7 committee on higher education, the secretary of education or a designee, the speaker of the house  
8 of representatives or a designee, the president of the senate or a designee, the minority leader of  
9 the house of representatives or a designee, the minority leader of the senate or a designee, the  
10 governor or a designee, the chair of the house committee on ways and means or a designee, the  
11 chair of the senate committee on ways and means or a designee, the house chair of the joint

12 committee on financial services or a designee, the senate chair of the joint committee on  
13 financial services or a designee, and 2 parents of school-aged children, the children of at least  
14 one of which shall be eligible for free or reduced lunch, who shall be nominated by the  
15 Massachusetts Parent Teacher Association.

16 SECTION 3. The Commission shall study the feasibility of creating, structuring,  
17 managing, marketing, and funding a universal children's savings account program in the  
18 Commonwealth. The committee shall: (a) review the structure and success of the Kindergarten to  
19 College (K2C) program in San Francisco and the status of similar programs in elsewhere in the  
20 United States, including New England, and abroad; (b) determine the projected population of  
21 children to be served; (c) consider the possible and best uses of the accounts by the recipients in  
22 creating asset-building opportunities for the recipients; (d) establish contacts with Massachusetts  
23 banks, credit unions, philanthropic organizations, and other area financial services that may be  
24 involved in similar efforts; (e) explore marketing and outreach protocols used in San Francisco  
25 and other states; (f) solicit information and testimony from those individuals, agencies, and  
26 entities that may be of assistance to the Commission in the performance of its duties, including  
27 but not limited to, the state treasurer, principals of urban and rural elementary schools, and a  
28 superintendent of a school district that includes a career and technical education center; and (g)  
29 develop a proposal for the Commonwealth that addresses the anticipated investment per student,  
30 guidelines for account maintenance, application procedures, and administrative costs.

31 SECTION 4. The members of the Commission shall elect a chairperson from among the  
32 members.. The first meeting of the Commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date  
33 of this section. Four members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum.

34           SECTION 5. The Commission shall report its findings and recommendations, together  
35 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry those recommendations into effect by filing the same  
36 with the clerks of the house of representatives and senate and the house and senate committees  
37 on ways and means not later than January 1, 2016.
