An Act ensuring equal access to medical treatments essential for people with autism.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 118E of General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 62 the following section:-

3 Section 63- The Division shall cover the cost of habilitative or rehabilitative medically  
4 necessary treatments for individuals aged 22 and older who have been diagnosed with one of the  
5 autism spectrum disorders by a licensed physician or a licensed psychologist who determines the  
6 care to be medically necessary. Treatments include, but are not limited to, applied behavior  
7 analysis supervised by a board certified behavior analyst that is necessary to develop, maintain or  
8 restore, to the maximum extent practicable, the functioning of an individual. In addition, the  
9 Division shall cover the cost of both dedicated and non-dedicated augmentative and alternative  
10 communication devices, including, but not limited to, medically necessary tablets.
