Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PUBLIC USE OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S AQUEDUCTS

4 Section 1. Chapter 372 of the acts of 1984 is hereby amended by inserting after section 73 the

5 following section:-

6 Section 74. Unless the board of directors of the Authority votes to prohibit access on a particular

7 area for security reasons, all aqueducts owned by the Commonwealth may be used by the public

8 for passive recreation. Such use shall not be subject to a charge or fee. No motorized vehicles

9 will be allowed on the aqueducts. The Authority and the Commonwealth shall be protected from

10 liability under section 17C of chapter 21.
