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In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to end child homelessness.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no family with children under 2 the age of eighteen shall be evicted of removed from public housing, publicly subsidized housing, or a shelter funded in whole or in part with public funds, including a motel or hotel 3 4 providing emergency shelter, unless and until the Department of Children and Families, in 5 consultation with the Department of Housing and Community Development, has developed and is able to implement a plan to assure that all children under eighteen in the affected family will 6 7 be housed in some location which is fit for human habitation. All reasonable efforts shall be 8 made to provide that such children remain in the custody of their parents or other caregivers with whom they have been residing. 9
