## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to regulate health insurance contracts/policies...

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 24B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following paragraph:
- 3 The commissioner shall also require health care insurers, including any self-insured sickness,
- 4 health, or welfare plan under this section, to recover all payments due from patients for covered
- 5 services. For purposes of this section, payments due from patients for covered services include
- 6 deductibles and co-insurance, and shall further be attributed to each patient on an annual basis or
- 7 for the period of the patient's period of coverage. Said health care insurers shall include
- 8 payments due from patients for covered health care services in their payments to providers;
- 9 provided however, that such payment shall not be delayed based on a delay in recovering the

- 10 payment due from the patient. Nothing in this section shall prohibit providers and insurers from
- 11 mutually agreeing to alternative billing and payment processes when it has been determined that
- 12 the patient has or can obtain secondary insurance coverage for the services provided.
- 13 SECTION 2. The commissioner of insurance shall promulgate regulations to enforce the
- 14 provisions of this Act no later than 90 days after the effective date of the Act. Such regulations
- 15 shall be effective for provider contracts and enrollees' policies which are entered into, renewed,
- 16 or amended on or after the regulations effective date.
