An Act relative to James Ward.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The General Laws are hereby amended by inserting after Chapter 90I, the following
2 chapter

3 Chapter 90J. Whoever operates a snow vehicle or a recreation vehicle and, without
4 stopping and making known his name, address and the registration number of his snow vehicle
5 or recreation vehicle, leave the scene after knowingly colliding with or otherwise causing bodily
6 injury to another person shall, if the injuries result in the death of a person, be punished by
7 imprisonment in the state prison for not less than 2 ½ years nor more than 10 years.
