## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to motor vehicle police chases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 268 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following section:-
- 3 Section 41. Whoever knowingly operates a motor vehicle on a street, road, alley, or
- 4 highway in this state, to intentionally flee or attempt to elude a law enforcement officer after
- 5 having received a signal from the officer to bring the vehicle to a stop shall be punished. If
- 6 convicted the penalty shall be up to 2 1/2 years in the house of correction and up to one year in
- 7 state prison. In addition the driver shall receive a fine no less than \$500 and no more than
- 8 \$5,000.
