An Act to eliminate asset limits for homeless shelters.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 30 of chapter 23B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 48, the words “or personal property”.

3           SECTION 2. Subsection (B) of said section 30 of said chapter 23B, as so appearing, is  
4   hereby amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following paragraph:-

5           A person shall not be denied assistance under this section based wholly or in part on the  
6   amount of the person’s assets; provided, however, that any income generated by such assets may  
7   be treated as countable income.
