Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 24C of chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the figure “265”, in line 8, the following words:- ,
- 3 or an arrest, investigation or complaint for assault and battery upon a child under section 13J.
