The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act upholding bidding integrity in the Commonwealth .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Amend Section 29 of Chapter 29F of the General Laws as appearing in the 2010 official
2 Edition:

3 (j) Any employer, contractor or subcontractor, or any officer or agent thereof who has
4 been debarred under this section, who contracts or otherwise secures or participates in contract
5 from which they are barred shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250,000 or by
6 imprisonment for not more than one year for a first offense, or by both such fine and
7 imprisonment and for a subsequent willful offense a fine of not more than \$500,000, or by
8 imprisonment for not more than two years, or by both such fine and such imprisonment.
