An Act relative to substance abuse services.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 113 of Chapter 58 of the Acts of 2006 is hereby amended in the first
- 2 sentence by striking out after the words, “commissioner of mental health”, the words, “for all of
- 3 the behavioral health benefits” and inserting in place thereof the following words:-
- 4 for all of the mental health benefits and the commissioner of public health for all of the substance
- 5 abuse benefits
