In the Year Two Thousand and Nine

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DELIBERATE SPREAD OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 205 of the
- 2 acts of 2008, is hereby amended by inserting after section 47 the following new section:—
- 3 Section 48. (a) No person who is or has been afflicted with acquired immunodeficiency
- 4 syndrome (AIDS), AIDS related complexities (ARC), or other manifestations of human
- 5 immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection, so called, shall engage in one or more of the following
- 6 activities:
- 7 (1) Knowingly engaging in sexual intercourse without first informing the partner of his infection;
- 9 (2) Knowingly committing an act of prostitution with another person;
- 10 (3) Knowingly selling or donating blood, blood products, semen, tissue, organs, and other bodily fluids;
- 12 (4) Knowingly sharing with another person a hypodermic needle or syringe without first 13 informing the person that the syringe has been used by a person infected with HIV.
- 14 A violation of this section shall be punished by imprisonment in state prison for a period of no
- less than five years and nor more than 15 years or by a fine of no less than \$5000 and no more
- 16 than \$15,000, or both.

18 (b) Any person who is convicted of violating section 22, 22A, 22B, 22C, or 23 of this chapter 19 and is afflicted with AIDS, ARC, or other manifestations of HIV infection at the time of the 20 crime may be subject to an increase of five years to the term of imprisonment.
