An Act relative to the use of telephones in places of detention.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 33A of Chapter 276 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 1998 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the phrase, "...the  
3 services of an attorney.", the following sentence:—"The accused shall also be afforded the  
4 opportunity to place a 2nd call to make arrangements for the care of a dependent person or pet."
