In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to farmers markets.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 10 of chapter 40 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- Any person who displays, exhibits or sells their homemade or home grown products or
- 4 produce within the commonwealth at public farmers' markets and farm stands shall be allowed
- 5 to provide customers with taste samples of their products without incurring any liability.
- 6 Conformity to sanitary health codes and requirements such as sinks and heating apparatus shall
- 7 not be applicable under this paragraph.
