# RESOLVE An Act to protect the health of the citizens of the Commonwealth

Resolved,

- 1 Whereas there are serious incidents across the Commonwealth involving the impact of large
- 2 windmill turbines on the health of its citizens, and
- 3 Whereas people, who live in close proximity to wind turbines or who are concerned about the
- 4 siting of windmills, are concerned about the health impacts of wind turbines,
- 5 Therefore be it resolved that there shall be a Special Commission on the Health Impacts of Wind
- 6 Turbines on the citizens of the Commonwealth. Said Commission shall be comprised of the
- 7 House and Senate Chairmen of the Joint Committee on Public Health as well as the House and
- 8 Senate ranking minority member on the committee, the House and Senate Chairman of the Joint
- 9 Telecommunication and Energy Committee and the ranking House and Senate minority member,
- 10 the Commissioner of Department of Public Health or his designee, a scientist who shall be
- 11 knowledgeable about the health affects of windmills who shall be appointed by the Governor,
- 12 three epidemiologists one each who shall be appointed by the Governor, the Senate President and
- 13 the Speaker of the House, the CEO of the Barnstable County Department of Public Health, the

- 14 Executive Director or designee of the Berkshire Regional Planning Commission, a municipal
- 15 health agent to be appointed by the Massachusetts Association of Boards of Health, a member of
- 16 the Massachusetts Medical Society who shall serve as chair, a member of the Massachusetts
- 17 Municipal Association knowledgeable about the health effects of wind turbines and three citizens
- 18 of the Commonwealth living within 3000 feet of an operating wind turbine one of each to be
- 19 appointed by the Regional Planning Agencies of the counties of Barnstable, Berkshire and
- 20 Worcester.
- 21 Said study shall commence within 30 days of the enactment of this bill and said Commission
- 22 shall file a report no later than September 30, 2012. Said Commission shall study all facets of
- 23 health impacts of windmills including but not limited to the effects of low frequency noise on
- 24 humans and animals, sleep disorders, difficulty with equilibrium, headaches, childhood night
- 25 terrors, effects on the inner ear, learning and mood disorders, panic attacks, irritability,
- 26 concentration, and memory, noise, flicker, proximity, size of wind turbine, and wind conditions.
- 27 Said study shall make recommendations to the Great and General Court on legislation designed
- 28 to protect the health of the citizens of the Commonwealth including an acceptable distance to site
- 29 a wind turbine project from dwellings, and businesses, and from municipal, commercial and
- 30 residential property lines, an optimum wind turbine size and design that reduces or lessens health
- 31 impacts and, a recommendation as to whether wind turbine projects should be reviewed by local
- 32 boards of health as part of the permitting process and any other matter that may come before the
- 33 Study Commission that will enhance the protection of the public health.
