An Act relative to the prevention of child sex abuse.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby 2 amended by inserting after section 23, the following new section:-
- 3 Section 23 ½.
- 4 (a) Whoever unlawfully has sexual intercourse or unnatural sexual intercourse, and 5 abuses a child under 13 years of age, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for 6 life or for any term of years, but not less than 25 years. The sentence imposed on such person
- 7 shall not be reduced to less than 25 years, or suspended, nor shall any person convicted under
- 8 this subsection be eligible for probation, parole, work release or furlough or receive any
- 9 deduction from his sentence for good conduct until he shall have served 25 years of such 10 sentence.
- 11 (b) Whoever is convicted of a second offense of this section shall be punished by 12 imprisonment in the state prison for life or for any term of years, but not less than 40 years. The 13 sentence imposed on such person shall not be reduced to less than 40 years, or suspended, nor
- shall any person convicted under this subsection be eligible for probation, parole, work release or
- 15 furlough or receive any deduction from his sentence for good conduct until he shall have served
- 16 40 years of such sentence.
- 17 (c) Whoever is convicted of a third or subsequent offense of this section shall be 18 punished by imprisonment in the state prison for life. No person convicted of a third offense of
- 19 this section shall be eligible for parole.
