An Act relative to home confinement during parole and probation for habitual criminals.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Subsection (a) of section 25 of chapter 279 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- An individual considered
- 3 a habitual criminal under this subsection who is placed on probation or granted parole shall be
- 4 required to serve the duration of probation or parole subject to home confinement.
