**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to fairness in workers' compensation benefits.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 152 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out section 27 in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the  
3 following:

4 “Section 27. If the employee is injured by reason of his serious willful misconduct,  
5 including intoxication or unlawful use of a controlled substance, as defined in section 1 of  
6 chapter 94C, he shall not receive compensation or any portion of the benefit; provided, that this  
7 provision shall not bar compensation or benefits to his or her dependents if the injury results in  
8 death.”
