### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to online posting of CMR's.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1: Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, each agency
- within the Executive branch must post all relevant Code of Massachusetts Regulations (CMR) on
- 3 the Executive agency's website. Each agency must further update said regulations by June 30 of
- 4 each year.
- 5 SECTION 2: This act shall become effective on July 1, 2018.
