In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act creating a tax exemption for college savings plan contributions  $\Box$ .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Paragraph (a) of Part B of section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as

2 most recently amended by section 42 of chapter 139 of the acts of 2006, is hereby further

3 amended by adding the following paragraph: -

4 16. All amounts contributed to college savings plans offered by Massachusetts educational

5 financing authority for college tuition, provided that if the child for whom the plan is established

6 fails to complete 18 hours of college as a fulltime student by his twenty-first birthday, all

7 amounts exempted shall be repaid to the commonwealth.
