Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 87 of chapter 276 of the General Laws is hereby amended by 2 adding the following paragraph:-3 "A judge may exercise discretion in placing a defendant on probation and consider the following: 4 5 (i) age; 6 (ii) nature of the defendant's military service, if any; 7 (iii) education; 8 (iv) injuries or wounds sustained; 9 (v) military discipline record, if the defendant served in the military;

11	(vii) family and medical psychological reports;
12	(viii) nature of past criminal convictions, if any;
13	(ix) age of previous criminal convictions, if any;
14	(x) employment status;
15	(xi) arrest record;
16	(xii) nature of current criminal matter and, if violent, the nature and extent of any injuries
17	to the victim and the relationship of victim to defendant;
18	(xiii) the availability of family and community support systems;
19	(xiv) the proposed probation terms; and
20	(xv) any other facts or circumstances having a bearing on pre-trial probation."
