**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act Relative to Out-of-State Travel and Unemployment Insurance Benefits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 25 of Chapter 151A of the General Laws, as most recently amended
2 by chapter 144 of the acts of 2014, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (k) the
3 following new subsection:--

4 (l) No benefits shall be awarded to an individual who leaves the Commonwealth of
5 Massachusetts for more than 2 consecutive weeks, except in a case of necessity or emergency.
