Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1.	Chapter	118E of the	General Laws,	as appearing in	n the 2012 Official

2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 10G the following new section:-

3 "Section 10H. The division shall provide coverage for telemedicine behavioral health

4 services in circumstances where geography, specialty or linguistic and cultural capacity dictates

5 that in office visits are not within a reasonable distance."

6 SECTION 2. Section 47BB of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012

7 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after paragraph (a) the following new

8 paragraph:-

9 "(b) An insurer shall cover telemedicine behavioral health services in circumstances 10 where geography, specialty or linguistic or cultural capacity dictates that in office visits are not 11 within a reasonable distance."
