By Representative Torrissi of North Andover and Senator Eldridge, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1832) of David M. Torrissi and others for an appropriation of a certain sum of money to provide for the establishment of an education loan repayment program for social workers. Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act establishing an education loan repayment program for social workers in areas of need.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. To provide for certain unanticipated obligations of the commonwealth, to provide
2 for an alteration of purpose for current appropriations, and to meet certain requirements of law,
3 the sum set forth in this section is hereby appropriated from the General Fund unless specifically
4 designated otherwise in this section, for the several purposes and subject to the conditions
5 specified in this section, and subject to the laws regulating the disbursement of public funds for
6 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. This sum shall be in addition to any amounts previously
7 appropriated and made available for the purposes of this item.

10 Pilot Program Trust Fund established in section 2 of this act
11 \$1,200,000

12 SECTION 2. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary,
13 there shall be a licensed certified social worker student education loan repayment pilot program,
14 hereinafter referred to as the pilot program, for the purpose of increasing and retaining access to
15 child welfare services and social services in the commonwealth. The pilot program shall provide
16 financial assistance to eligible program participants to assist them in repaying student education
17 loans, as defined in this section; provided, that the pilot program shall be limited to a total of 100
18 licensed certified social workers.

19 The pilot program shall be administered by the board of higher education. The board, in
20 collaboration with the executive office of health and human services, shall promulgate guidelines
21 governing the pilot program. The guidelines shall include, but need not be limited to, the
22 following provisions: (1) eligibility shall be limited to persons with incomes that do not exceed
23 500% of the federal poverty level; (2) eligibility shall be limited to persons entering the field of
24 social work after July 1, 2011; (3) eligibility shall be limited to social workers who are licensed
25 certified social workers as defined in section 130 of chapter 112 of the General Laws and who
26 are employed in child welfare, or in a geographic or programmatic setting defined as high need
27 under the guidelines governing the pilot program; (4) the commonwealth shall repay a student
28 education loan at a rate not to exceed \$250 per month for a period not to exceed 48 months; (5)
29 payments by the commonwealth shall be made directly to the lender on behalf of a pilot program
30 participant, and shall cover only loan payments owed by the participant in the months during
31 which the participant works in the commonwealth as a licensed certified social worker in child
32 welfare, or in a geographic or programmatic setting defined as high need under pilot program

33 guidelines; (6) procedures for selecting 100 pilot program participants among eligible applicants;
34 and (7) measures to deal with situations in which a pilot program participant ceases to comply
35 with program requirements.

36 For the purposes of this section, the term student education loan shall mean any indebtedness,
37 including interest on such indebtedness, incurred to pay tuition, fees or other direct expenses
38 incurred in connection with the pursuit of an undergraduate or graduate degree by an applicant,
39 but shall not include loans made by any person related to the applicant, or loans paid by credit
40 card.

41 (b) There is hereby established and set up on the books of the commonwealth a separate fund to
42 be known as the Licensed Certified Social Worker Student Education Loan Repayment Pilot
43 Program Trust Fund, hereinafter referred to as the Licensed Certified Social Worker Education
44 Loan Repayment Fund, to which shall be credited any appropriations or other monies authorized
45 by the general court and designated to be credited thereto. The board of higher education shall
46 hold the Licensed Certified Social Worker Education Loan Repayment Fund in an account
47 separate from other funds or accounts. Amounts credited to the Licensed Certified Social
48 Worker Education Loan Repayment Fund shall be used, without further appropriation, by the
49 commissioner of higher education or his designee, to carry out the licensed certified social
50 worker student education loan repayment pilot program established in this section.

51 (c) The licensed certified social worker student education loan repayment pilot program shall
52 expire once the final payment is made under this section by the board of higher education on
53 behalf of all pilot program participants. The board of higher education shall evaluate the
54 effectiveness of the pilot program and its benefits and costs to the commonwealth and shall

55 submit a report, together with its recommendations on whether a permanent program should be
56 established and if so how such program should be structured, to the general court by filing the
57 report with the house and senate committees on ways and means and the joint committee on
58 higher education, not less than one year prior to the expiration of the pilot program.
