**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to foster care recruitment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, annually, not
2 later than October 31, the department of children and families shall submit a special report on its
3 foster care campaign to recruit new foster parents to the child advocate, the clerks of the senate
4 and house of representatives, the house and senate committees on ways and means and the joint
5 committee on children, families, and persons with disabilities. The report shall be made available
6 to the public electronically in accordance with section 19 of chapter 66 of the General Laws. The
7 report shall include, but not be limited to, the: (i) number of new foster care parents as a result of
8 the foster care campaign; (ii) the costs associated with such a recruitment effort; (iii) difficulties
9 impeding DCF’s ability to recruit additional foster parents; and (ii) methods in which the

10 department is recruiting foster care parents. The department may satisfy the reporting
11 requirements of this section by providing the requested information in an annual report filed.

12 SECTION 2. Section 1 is hereby repealed.

13 SECTION 3. Section 2 shall take effect on December 31, 2024.
