An Act to provide deemed certification for CPOE/EMR requirements.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

I	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding sections 36 and 37 of chapter 305 of the acts of 2008 or
2	any other general or special law to the contrary, a hospital shall be deemed in compliance with
3	implementing a computerized physician order entry system and an interoperable electronic
4	health records system, as determined by the Department of Public Health upon licensure review,
5	if:
6	\Box (a) For the purposes of an acute care hospital, demonstrate successful registration and
7	attestation to meeting the Stage 1 of the federal meaningful use standards in effect and as
8	outlined by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services by December 31, 2013;
9	\Box (b) For the purposes of hospitals that are not deemed an acute care hospital by the federal
10	Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, begun use of a certified EHR technology by
11	December 31, 2015, which has been tested and certified by an Office of the National Coordinator
12	Authorized Testing and Certification Body.
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
