The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act increasing penalties for restraining order violations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 7 of Chapter 209A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended in the fifth paragraph, by striking out the first sentence and inserting
- 3 in place thereof the following:-
- 4 "Any violation of such order or a protection order issued by another jurisdiction shall, if a
- 5 first offense, be punishable by a fine of not more than five thousand dollars, or by imprisonment
- 6 for not more than two and one-half years in a house of correction, or by both such fine and
- 7 imprisonment. Second or subsequent offenses shall be punishable by a fine of not more than ten
- 8 thousand dollars, imprisonment in a state prison for a term of not more than five years, or by
- 9 both such fine and imprisonment.".
