The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to the treatment of glaucoma.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general laws to the contrary, Massachusetts
2 optometrists licensed under chapter 94C shall have the authority to treat glaucoma and ocular
3 abnormalities of the human eye and the adjoining and adjacent tissue, as well as prescribe all
4 necessary eye related medications including all oral anti-infective medications.

5 Nothing in this section shall permit optometric utilization of or prescription of (i)
6 therapeutic pharmaceutical agents for the treatment of systematic diseases; (ii) invasive surgical
7 procedures, (iii) pharmaceutical agents administered by sub dermal injection, intramuscular
8 injection, intravenous injection, subcutaneous injection or retro bulbar injection, (iv) opioid
9 injections.

10 Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the Board of Registration in Optometry is
11 hereby directed to determine all professional and education requirements necessary to provide
12 optometric treatment of glaucoma and the prescription of all oral anti-infective medications.

13 Prior to any Massachusetts licensed optometrists utilizing said glaucoma medications and
14 all oral anti-infective medications, an optometrist must complete an educational program
15 administered by the Massachusetts Society of Optometrists which shall be approved by an
16 accredited college of optometry or medicine or shall otherwise meet the guidelines and
17 requirements of the board of registration of optometry. The Board of Registration in Optometry
18 shall provide, to the Department of Public Health and to each successful applicant, a certificate
19 of qualification in the utilization and prescription of all therapeutic pharmaceutical agents
20 necessary to treat glaucoma and all oral anti-infective medications.

21 Within 90 days after the effective date of this act, the Department of Public Health and
22 the Board of Registration in Optometry shall promulgate the rules and regulations necessary to
23 effectuate the purpose of this act.
