The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to office-based surgery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION . Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following
section:-

3 □Section 230. (a) For the purposes of this section the following terms shall have the following 4 meanings:-

- 5 D"Deep sedation/ analgesia", a drug-induced depression of consciousness during which patients
- 6 cannot be easily aroused but respond purposefully following repeated or painful stimulation. The
- 7 ability to independently maintain ventilatory function may be impaired. Patients may require
- 8 assistance in maintaining a patent airway, and spontaneous ventilation may be inadequate.
- 9 Cardiovascular function is usually maintained.
- 11 with absence of pain sensation over the entire body, in which the patient's protective airway
- 12 reflexes may be impaired and the patient may be unable to maintain a patent natural airway.
- 13 Sedation that unintentionally progresses to the point at which the patient's protective airway
- 14 reflexes are impaired and the patient is unable to maintain a patent natural airway is considered
- 15 general anesthesia.
- 17 patients respond purposefully to verbal commands, either alone or accompanied by tactile
- 18 stimulation. No interventions are required to maintain a patent airway, and spontaneous
- 19 ventilation is adequate. Cardiovascular function is usually maintained.
- 20 \square "Office-based surgery", any surgery or invasive medical procedure requiring analgesia or
- 21 sedation, when performed in a location other than a hospital or hospital associated surgical
- 22 center.

- 23 \square (b) Any office performing office-based surgery operated by a licensed health care provider or
- 24 organization at which moderate sedation/analgesia, deep sedation/analgesia or general anesthesia
- 25 is administered shall be accredited by at least one of the following entities: (1) The Medicare
- 26 program; (2) the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care; (3) the American
- 27 Association for Accreditation of Ambulatory Surgery Facilities, Inc.; (4) the Joint Commission
- 28 on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations; or (5) any other nationally recognized accrediting
- 29 agency approved by the board of registration in medicine. Such accreditation shall be obtained
- 30 not later than 18 months after July 1, 2014, or 18 months after the date on which moderate
- 31 sedation/analgesia, deep sedation/analgesia or general anesthesia is first administered at such
- 32 office or facility, whichever is later. Upon the expiration of the applicable 18 month period, no
- 33 moderate sedation/analgesia, deep sedation/analgesia or general anesthesia may be administered
- 34 at any such office or facility that does not receive accreditation as required by this section.
- 35 \Box (c) Evidence of such accreditation shall be maintained at any such office or facility at which
- 36 moderate sedation/analgesia, deep sedation/analgesia or general anesthesia is administered and
- 37 shall be made available for inspection upon request of the department.
- 38 \Box (d) The board of registration in medicine may revoke, suspend or deny renewal of the license
- 39 of a practitioner who violates this section.
