*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1           The second paragraph of section 328A of chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following sentence:- Volunteer food servers at a charitable potluck event
- 3 shall not be subject to food server regulation by the department of public health or any local
- 4 board of health.
