An Act relative to drug disposal by mail.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 225. (a) There is hereby established within the department, the unused
4 prescription drug disposal program. The purpose of the program is to ensure the safe, effective
5 and proper disposal of prescription drugs as defined in section 1 of chapter 94C.

6 (b) The department shall create a system for the return of unused prescription drugs. The
7 system shall use prepaid mailing envelopes into which the unused prescription drugs are placed
8 and returned to a single collection location. The prepaid mailing envelopes shall be made
9 available to the public at various locations, including, but not limited to, pharmacies, physicians'
10 offices and post offices. The agency may randomly assess the toxicity of materials received
11 under the program as long as the assessment results do not identify the patient, person who
12 mailed the material, prescriber or pharmacy.

13 (c) The department shall ensure that only department employees handle the unused
14 prescription drugs received pursuant to this section. The unused prescription drugs shall be

15 disposed of by the department in a manner that is designed to be effective, secure and in
16 compliance with local, state and federal environmental and drug disposal requirements, including
17 the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, as amended and the Secure and
18 Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010.

19 (d) The department shall adopt rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this
20 section.
