**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**  
—————

An Act to affecting property owners and employers rights regarding medical marijuana.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law or special law to the contrary, any person or entity  
2 that has regulated smoking on private property including business property open to the public,  
3 owned or controlled by such person or entity shall be deemed to have prohibited smoking of any  
4 marijuana as defined in Chapter 94 of the general laws, including medical marijuana, unless such  
5 person or entity affirmatively permits smoking of medical marijuana on their properties.  
6 Prohibition of smoking marijuana, including medical marijuana on private property, shall not be  
7 deemed to be discrimination due to a medical condition under the laws of the commonwealth.

8 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
