In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)

An Act pertaining to firefighter training.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 165 of chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentences: "Said standards shall  
3 reflect the individual needs of communities as far as target hazards and local needs dictate. If  
4 disputes concerning standards are not resolved, National Fire Protection Association standards  
5 shall apply. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a local fire training academy shall be  
6 given the authority to certify firefighting personnel subject to meeting the aforementioned  
7 standards.
