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In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act creating a special commission studying cutting, welding and hot work processes regulated by the State Fire Code.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be a special commission established on welding and hot works 2 regulation. The commission shall investigate and study the current requirements for licenses and 3 permits governing cutting, welding, and other hot work processes involving burning or a similar operation that is capable of initiating fires or explosions to determine if the state fire code 4 adequately protects the safety of the public and first responders. The study shall consider the 5 current conditions required for the issuance of licenses or permits, the use of supervised details 6 and firewatchers, the adequacy of fees to cover inspection and oversight and other municipal 7 costs, the deterrent effect of penalties for violations of rules and regulations and cost recovery 8 9 assessment for damages resulting from the failure to comply with rules and regulations, the

10 training and certification required to perform the work and any other matters the commission 11 finds that would enhance the safety of the work. The commission shall report its findings, 12 including any proposed legislation, to the house and senate committees on ways and means, the 13 joint committee on public safety and homeland security and the executive office of public safety 14 and security no later than June 1, 2016.

15 SECTION 2. The commission shall consist of: one member of the fire chief's association 16 of Massachusetts, one member appointed by the Governor who shall have experience and expertise in cutting, welding and hot works trades, one member appointed by the president of the 17 senate, one member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, the house and 18 19 senate chairs of the joint committee on public safety and homeland security or their designees, one member of the minority party from both the house and senate appointed by the minority 2021 leader of those branches respectively, the state fire marshal or his designee, the commissioner of the Boston Fire Department of his designee, the chairman of the board of fire prevention 22 regulations or his designee, the associate commissioner of the vocational workforce and college 23 readiness programs, or his designee, 2 representative of a labor organization representing 24 25 pipefitters and carpenters chosen by the president of the Massachusetts AFL-CIO, the President of the Ironworkers District Council of New England or his designee and a representative from 26 27 the Professional Fire Fighters of Massachusetts chosen by its president.
