An Act relative to the licensing of glaziers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. The General Laws are hereby amended by inserting after chapter 142A the following chapter:
 Chapter 142B

 Licensing of Glaziers

 As used in this chapter the following words shall have the following meanings:
 "Glazier", any person regularly offering to the general public services of his employees or himself in the field of flat glass work,
- 9 "Flat glass work", installing, maintaining or repairing glass in residential or 10 commercial structures,
- SECTION 2. There shall be a board of state examiners of glasses to consist of 9 member 12 s, 1 of 3 of whom shall be a general contractor licensed to perform automotive glass work, 3 of

whom shall be a general contractor licensed to perform flat glass work, 1 of whom shall be a municipal building official, 1 of whom shall be a general contractor and 1 of whom shall be a licensed architect to be appointed by the Governor. This general contractor requirement to be licensed to perform glass work shall not be required to be licensed until January 1, 2014.

17 SECTION 3. The board of examiners of glazie rs shall hold at least 4 examinations in each year at such time and place as the board may determine. To obtain a license the applicant 18 shall have attained his or her 18 th birthday. The applicant shall satisfy the board that he or she is of good moral char acter, has 3 years of classroom experience with a minimum of 144 hours with 20 21 a state approved school or union program, has 3 years of employment in glass trade with a minimum of 1800 hours per year, has passed a first aid course, that he or she is a residen t of the 22 23 Commonwealth by furnishing a picture ID and has a criminal record free of construction or glazing fraud. The applicant shall pay a file fee of \$75 for the examination. When an applicant has qualified for a license, the board shall, upon receipt of a fee of \$100 issue to such applicant a license to engage in Flat Glass work. Licenses shall be issued for a 2 year period subject to 26 27 renewal upon payment of a fee of \$100.
