In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to telemedicine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 176B of the General Laws as appearing in the 2014 Official
- 2 Edition is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following new section:-

4 Section 25.(a) For the purposes of this section, "telemedicine" as it pertains to the

- delivery of health care services, shall mean the use of interactive audio, video or other electronic
- 6 media for the purpose of diagnosis, consultation or treatment. "Telemedicine" shall not include
- 7 the use of audio-only telephone, facsimile machine or e-mail.
- 8 (b) A non profit medical service plan may limit coverage of telemedicine services to
- 9 those health care providers in a telemedicine network approved by the non profit medical service
- 10 plan.

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(c) A contract that provides coverage for services under this section may contain a provision for a deductible, copayment or coinsurance requirement for a health care service provided through telemedicine as long as the deductible, copayment or coinsurance does not exceed the deductible, copayment or coinsurance applicable to an in-person consultation,

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(d) Coverage for health care services under this section shall be consistent with coverage
for health care services provided through in-person consultation.
