**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**  
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An Act to reduce fraud in prescription drug abuse testing and help prevent substance abuse.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION ##. Chapter 118E of the general laws is hereby amended by adding at the end  
2 thereof the following new Section:

3 SECTION ##. To ensure appropriate and responsible use of drug testing, for laboratories  
4 providing toxicology testing, the Office of Medicaid is authorized to require that these providers  
5 demonstrate a functional and operational test-utilization and test-frequency control program that  
6 will ensure compliance with MassHealth’s utilization and frequency requirements for clinical  
7 drug testing.

8 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, an independent clinical  
9 laboratory, licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) by the

10 U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) that is located out-of-state and accredited by  
11 both the College of American Pathologists (CAP) and the New York State Clinical Laboratory  
12 Evaluation Program (CLEP), and providing and being reimbursed for managed Medicaid  
13 services in Massachusetts, shall be deemed eligible and qualified to participate as a MassHealth  
14 fee-for-service provider and eligible for payment for clinical toxicology testing purposes.  
15 Payments made to qualified laboratories under this section will only apply when a qualified  
16 laboratory provides toxicology test results to the referring health care provider within two  
17 business days of receipt of the test specimen.
