Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 40A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 9C the following section:-
- 3 Section 9D. A city or town that adopts or has adopted an inclusionary zoning ordinance
- 4 or by-law may also adopt an ordinance or by-law establishing a veterans' preference in private
- 5 development. A city or town that adopts a veterans' preference pursuant to this section may
- 6 offer up to 10 per cent of the city or town's low or moderate income housing inventory pursuant
- 7 to sections 20 through 23, inclusive, of chapter 40B and its implementing regulations to a
- 8 qualified veteran before the lottery process. This section shall not increase existing amount of
- 9 such affordable units set by the city or town. A veteran who meets all existing requirements for
- eligibility for low or moderate income housing shall be eligible for such veterans' preference;

- and the city or town may require proof of veteran status as the city or down deems necessary. If
- no veteran is eligible for such veterans' preference units, said units shall revert back to the
- general lottery.
