### AN ACT ENSURING ACCESS TO LIFE-SAVING COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENINGS .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section
2	110M the following section:-
3	Section 110N. Any policy, contract, agreement, plan or certificate of insurance issued, delivered or
4	renewed within the commonwealth shall cover and reimburse for all colorectal cancer examinations and
5	laboratory tests specified in current American Cancer Society (ACS) guidelines for colorectal cancer
6	screening of asymptomatic individuals. Coverage or benefits shall be provided for all such colorectal
7	screening examinations and tests that are administered at a frequency identified in the current ACS
8	guidelines for colorectal cancer. The coverage required under this section must meet the requirements set
9	forth in subsection (b).
10	(a) Benefits are provided under this section for a covered individual who is:
11	(1) At least fifty (50) years of age; or
12	(2) Less than fifty (50) years of age and at high risk for colorectal cancer according to
13	current colorectal cancer screening guidelines of the American Cancer Society;
14	(b) To encourage colorectal cancer screenings, patients and health care providers
15	must not be required to meet burdensome criteria or overcome significant
16	obstacles to secure such coverage. An individual shall not be required to pay an
17	additional deductible or coinsurance for testing that is greater than an annual
18	deductible or coinsurance established for similar benefits. If the program or
19	contract does not cover a similar benefit, a deductible or coinsurance may not be
20	set at a level that materially diminishes the value of the colorectal cancer benefit
21	required. Reimbursement to health care providers for colorectal cancer screenings
22	provided under this section shall be equal to or greater than reimbursement to
23	health care providers provided under Title XVII of the Social Security Act
24 25	(Medicare). <b>SECTION 2.</b> Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 8AA the

- SECTION 3. Chapter 176B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 4AA the
  following section:-
- 34 Section 4BB. Any subscription certificate under an individual or group medical service agreement
- delivered, issued or renewed within the commonwealth shall provide for the coverage of colorectal
- 36 screening examinations and tests that are administered at a frequency identified in the current
- 37 American Cancer Society guidelines for colorectal cancer as defined in, and subject to the
- 38 requirements and limitations of, Chapter 175 Section 110N.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 176G of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 4S the
  following section:-
- 41 Section 4T. Any individual or group health maintenance contract shall provide for the coverage of
- 42 colorectal screening examinations and tests that are administered at a frequency identified in the
- 43 current American Cancer Society guidelines for colorectal cancer as defined in, and subject to the
- 44 requirements and limitations of, Chapter 175 Section 110N.
- 45 SECTION 5. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 23 the
  46 following section:-
- 47 Section 24. Any coverage offered by the commission to any active or retired employee of the
- 48 commonwealth who is insured under the group insurance commission shall provide for the coverage of
- 49 colorectal screening examinations and tests that are administered at a frequency identified in the current
- 50 American Cancer Society guidelines for colorectal cancer as defined in, and subject to the requirements
- 51 and limitations of, Chapter 175 Section 110N.
