The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to group classification.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 3 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is
2	hereby amended by striking, in line 275, the words "and employees of the commonwealth or of
3	any county whose regular and major duties require them to have the care, custody, instruction or
4	other supervision of parolees or persons who are mentally ill or mentally defective or defective
5	delinquents or wayward children and employees of Cushing hospital" and inserting in place
6	thereof the following:- "and employees or former employees of the commonwealth or of any
7	county, and members of the state employees retirement system whose regular and majority of
8	their duties require them to have care, custody, instruction or other supervision, or require them
9	to provide services to parolees, persons who are mentally ill, or persons with physical,
10	functional, intellectual, or developmental disabilities, or delinquent youth, and employees of
11	Cushing hospital.".
